SMALL GROUPS

Youth Small Groups are an awesome opportunity for you to get connected with other students in J.A.M. (Junior High) or LYF (High School). The purpose of these groups is DISCIPLESHIP. If you are interested in joining a small group or are currently involved, here is a look at how the program works.

What are "small groups?"

Small Groups are geared for both junior high youth and senior high youth. They are groups of three to nine students (same gender and grade) that meet once a month with an adult leader. It is a time filled with Bible study, prayer, fellowship, accountability and fun!

When and Where do they meet?

Small Groups meet on the 1st Sunday of the month in the leader's home from 6-8 p.m. Some groups may vary their time after they start and compare schedules. Groups can be flexible on that day.

What is a Fun Day?
